News from the Blissfield High School Counseling & Career Center

- SAT, PSAT, WorkKeys, & M-STEP TEST RESULTS Results of the SAT, PSAT, WorkKeys, and M-STEP tests will be available to the student body later on this spring.
- MAY This year's AP (Advanced Placement) tests will be given in May, and the following subjects have exams available for students to be assessed on: AP Chemistry & AP Government, AP English Literature, and AP US History, AP World History & AP Computer Science and AP Physics. All tests will be given at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, and students can expect to hear back from the College Board in July with their test results.
- NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE All students interested in participating in division I or division II athletics in college should align their classes to NCAA guidelines. Anyone who plans on participating should register with the NCAA Clearinghouse as early as their Junior year. Visit the NCAA Clearinghouse web-site at NCAA.org for more information.
- DUAL ENROLLMENT MEETING There was a dual enrollment meeting for all qualifying students on what dual enrollment is, the process and qualifications to dual enroll, and the actual enrolling of students in a local
 - college or university, while still attending Blissfield High School. This coming fall, 60 Blissfield High School Students will be dual enrolled at both Blissfield High School and a local college or university.



- **STUDENT SCHEDULES** Students can expect to get their schedules during the summer break. There will also be designated times when students will be able to explore the possibility of changing their schedules: August 15th 10th grade (8:30-10:30 am), 11th grade (10:30-12:30pm), 12th grade (1:00-3:00pm) BHS dual enrolled courses on its campus are Both Spanish I, Spanish II, and Calculus/Analytic Geometry will be offered at Blissfield High School through Siena Heights.


